MAKE YOUR OWN SUNDIAL

King Hezekiah was so sick, he was going to die, but God sent a message through the prophet Isaiah that he would get well and live 15 more years! As a sign of this promise to King Hezekiah, God made the sun travel backwards in the sky!

Before there were clocks or watches, people used sundials to tell the time of day. Here is a fun activity for you to make your very own sundial.

These are the materials you will need:

- 1. A stick
- 2. Stones or chalk
- 3. Ball of clay or playdough
- 4. Watch or clock
- 5. Sunny spot in the yard, deck, or sidewalk

Here is what you will need to do:

- 1. Find a spot where the sun shines for most of the day
- 2. Secure the stick in the ground or clay
- 3. On the hour every hour, mark the shadow of the stick with a rock or chalk

Keep in mind that it may take you a few days to complete your sundial. Once you have your sundial measured out, have fun checking the time by the sun and not your watch.
